It's a big job, but one that's vital for our community's future. Roads is also front of mind this week with the Victorian Government awarding us a \$2 million grant via the Safer Local Roads Program. This funding will go directly towards improving key intersections and road safety infrastructure across the Shire. This is what our community has been asking for, safer roads and adequate investment in our community. Safer roads mean peace of mind for everyone - whether you're heading to work, school, or enjoying a weekend drive. This investment reflects our commitment to making the Southern Grampians a safer, more connected place to live and visit. As always, I'd like to take a moment to thank you, our incredible community. Your feedback and engagement provides the driving force behind everything we do.
