PHYSICAL DESCRIPTION:

he bluestone cottage is a small two roomed single storey bluestone cottage. The hipped roof is covered with corrugated iron. The windows are casements, suggesting an early date. There has been a small timber extension to the north. A verandah, possibly not original, has been demolished. Towards the rear there is a small brick outbuilding which is close to collapse.

HISTORY:

The land on which the cottage stands was purchased from the Crown by J. Sharrock on 21st December 1858. By 1870 Joseph Sharrock is only rated for land in the parish of Yalimba. (SMR RB 1870 #373.)

It is not known when the cottage and outbuildings were constructed but from their form, style, materials and detailing they appear to date from the 1860s.

What is significant?

The Bluestone cottage located at 11 Burchett Street in Penshurst is a small vernacular building of two rooms, possibly dating from the 1860s. The buildings are in fair condition, but retain a high degree of integrity.

How is it significant?

The Bluestone Cottage at 11 Burchett Street Penshurst is of historical significance to the Southern Grampians shire and to the township of Penshurst.

Why is it significant?

The Bluestone Cottage is of historical significance as an example of the small landholdings surrounding the early townships of the Shire. It provides us with information and evidence of a past way of life.
